Weak summer but encouraging signs for autumn

2013 has been very slow to "recover," but the business horizon is now looking a bit brighter.

Electronic equipment shipments failed to rally through late summer (*Chart 1*) but the key countries' PMI leading indicators finally all moved into "growth" territory in August (*Chart 2*). Looking forward these regional PMI leading indicator 3/12 growth rates are now indicating that the regional business cycles are once again in an expansion mode.

July global semiconductor sales were strong—rising 8% month-on-month and 5.1% on a 3-month average basis when comparing 2013 vs. 2012. A bit troubling however is N. America's sharp July increase (*Chart 4*) at a time when domestic electronic equipment shipments and orders were flat. Has N. America bought more chips than needed? Is inventory building or excess ordering driving the N. America semiconductor procurement growth spurt?

SEMI equipment sales are also improving (*Chart 5*). They have not returned

to levels of a year earlier yet but they are clearly growing.

Comparing the 3/12 growth rates of world electronic equipment, semiconductors and printed circuit sales to the global PMI leading indicator, growth (3/12>1) is either upon us or imminent throughout the supply chain (*Chart 6*).

Chart 7 summarizes my colleague Ed Henderson's recent electronic equipment production forecasts for 2013-2015. At this point it appears that we will close 2013 on an upturn with a decent expansion in 2014. Keep watching the numbers!
